

Visa Information

All international attendees are solely responsible for obtaining the appropriate and legal entry permits or visas required by the Taiwan government prior to travel.

We encourage foreign attendees to apply for visas as early as possible. Please consult or seek advice from your local embassy or overseas mission if you encounter problems during your application. They have the expertise and experience to handle visa-related matters efficiently to ensure a smooth process.

VISA-Exempt Entry

Passport holders of the following-mentioned nationalities can stay for up to 14-90 days without applying for a visa.

eVISA

Passport holders of the following-mentioned nationalities are eligible for an eVisa.

Duration of Stay	Country
30 DAYS	Bahrain, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Colombia*, Dominica, Ecuador, Haiti, Kuwait, Mauritius, Montenegro, Oman, Panama, Peru, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Türkiye*, United Arab Emirates.

* Colombian passport holders must provide a valid visa or resident certificate issued by a Schengen country or a valid resident certificate or visa valid for more than 180 days issued by the United States.

* Türkiye: Only holders of ordinary passports and special passports will be eligible for an eVisa.
