Open Workgroup

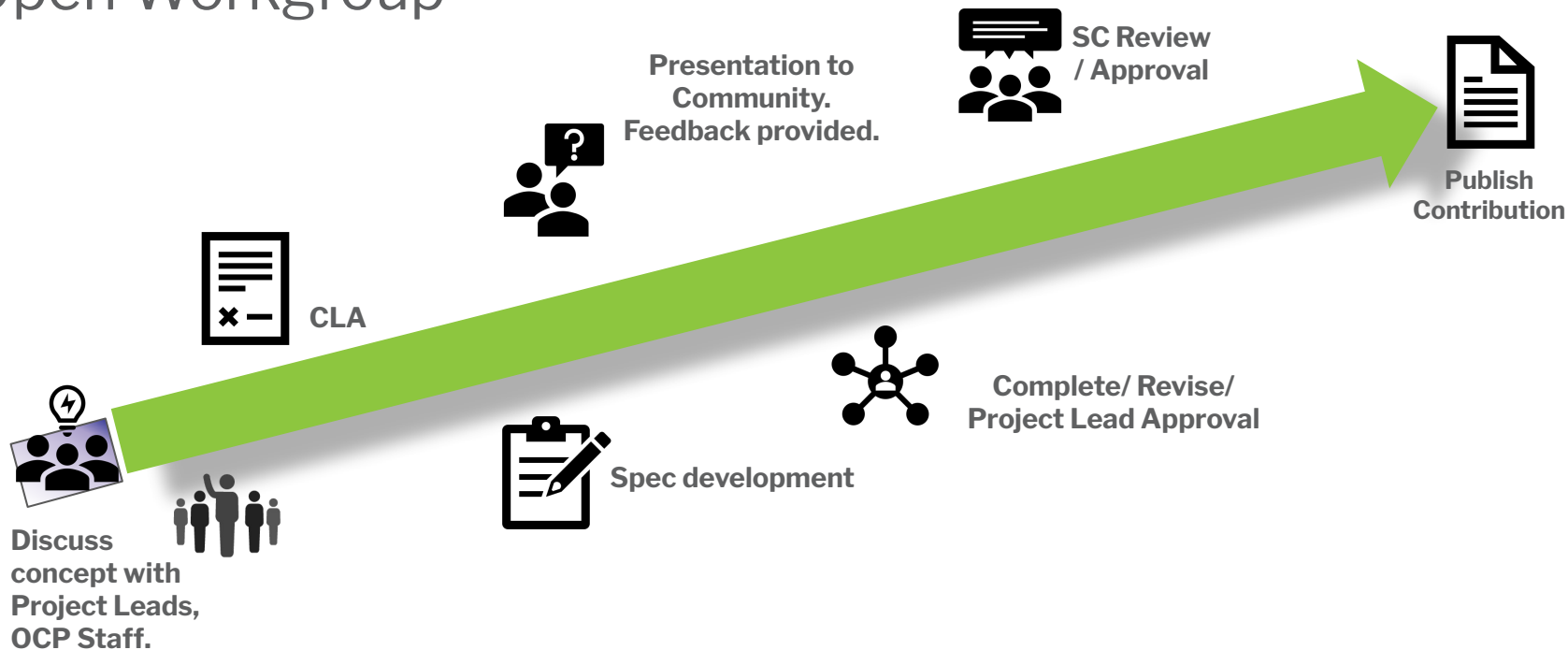
- Contributors (CLA signers) present publicly to an OCP Project for feedback, approval from Project leadership.
- Published as an open contribution once approved.

Semi-Private Workstream (SPW)*

- Contributors (CLA signers) collaborate amongst themselves using OCP tools.
- *May* seek feedback from orgs that are invited to sign the OCP Feedback Agreement. Not required at start of SPW.
- Published as an open contribution once approved.

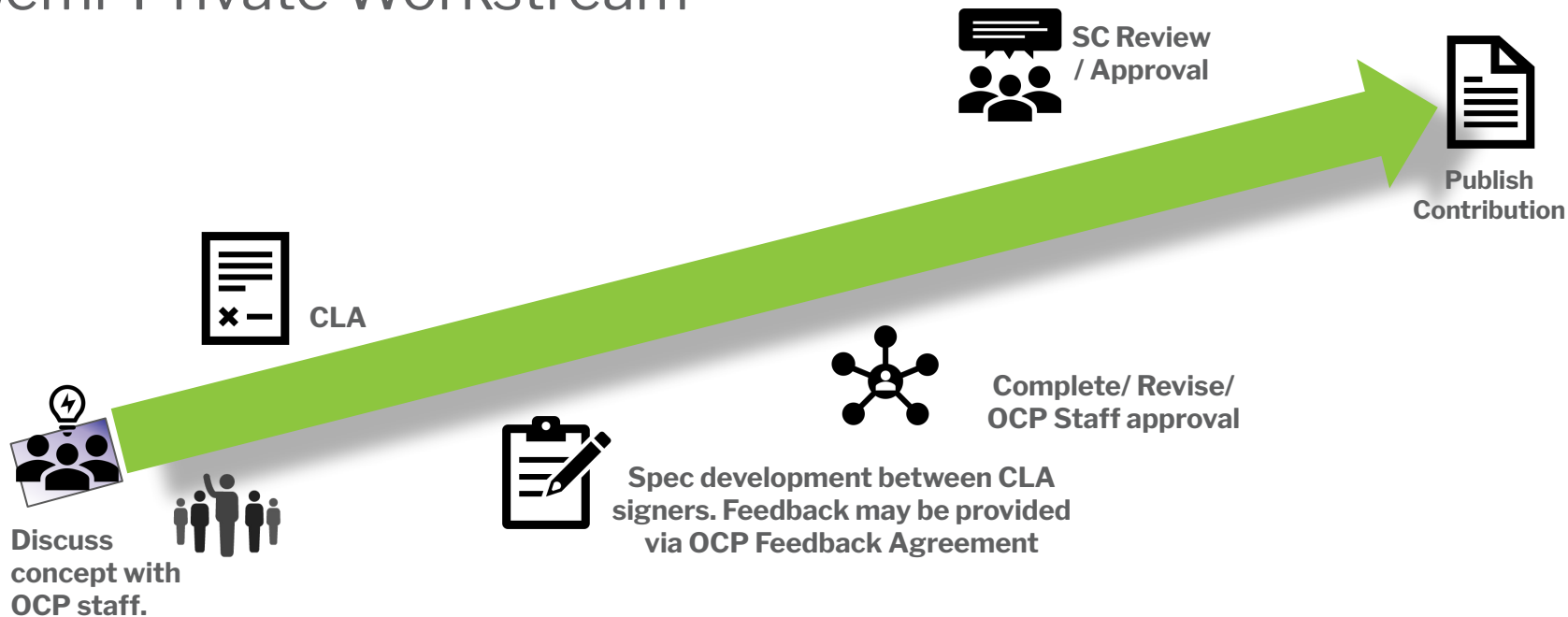

Open Workgroup

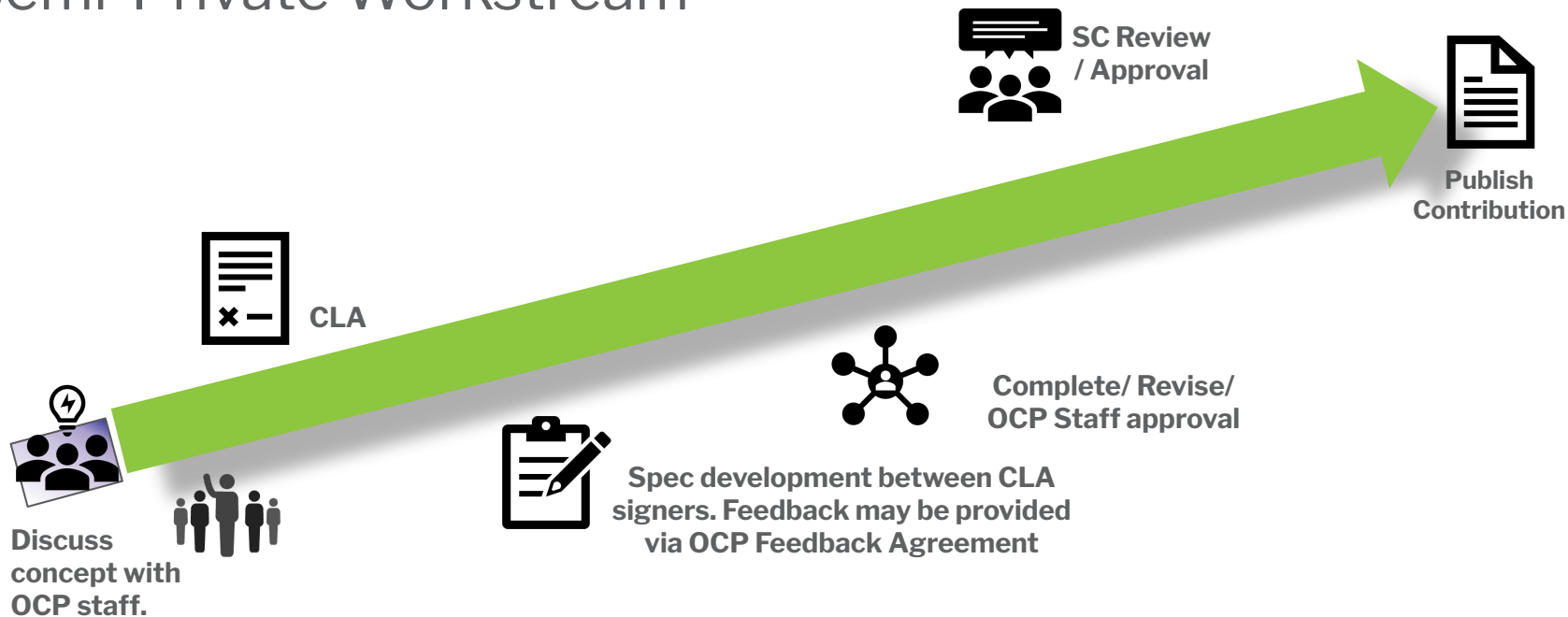
- **No changes to open workstream.**
 - Contributors (CLA signers) present publicly to an OCP Project for feedback, approval from Project leadership
 - Published as an open contribution once approved.

Semi-Private Workstream (SPW)

- **After 12 months as an SPW or after the first contribution:**
 - Contributors (CLA signers) collaborate amongst themselves using OCP tools.
 - *Must* issue an open invitation to the OCP Community to sign the OCP Feedback Agreement.
 - Published as an open contribution once approved.

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Semi-Private Workstream



OCP Semi-Private Workstream



Process:

Organizations that wish to provide feedback to the contributors *must* sign an OCP Feedback Agreement.

This agreement allows for highly technical feedback to be provided to the contributors while protecting all those involved. Please note that the Feedback Agreement is self-limiting - you are not required to provide feedback, however any feedback given may be freely utilized by the contributing organizations.
